This will impact roughly 42 million Americans for whom food insecurity is already an issue. If and when SNAP benefits are reinstated, new restrictions are planned. Among the proposed changes are lowering the age of dependent children to 14 and raising the work requirement to 64, ending exemptions for veterans, homeless people, and young adults aging out of foster care. As winter and the holidays are approaching your assistance is greatly needed and appreciated. Thank you for supporting our ongoing mission.
