

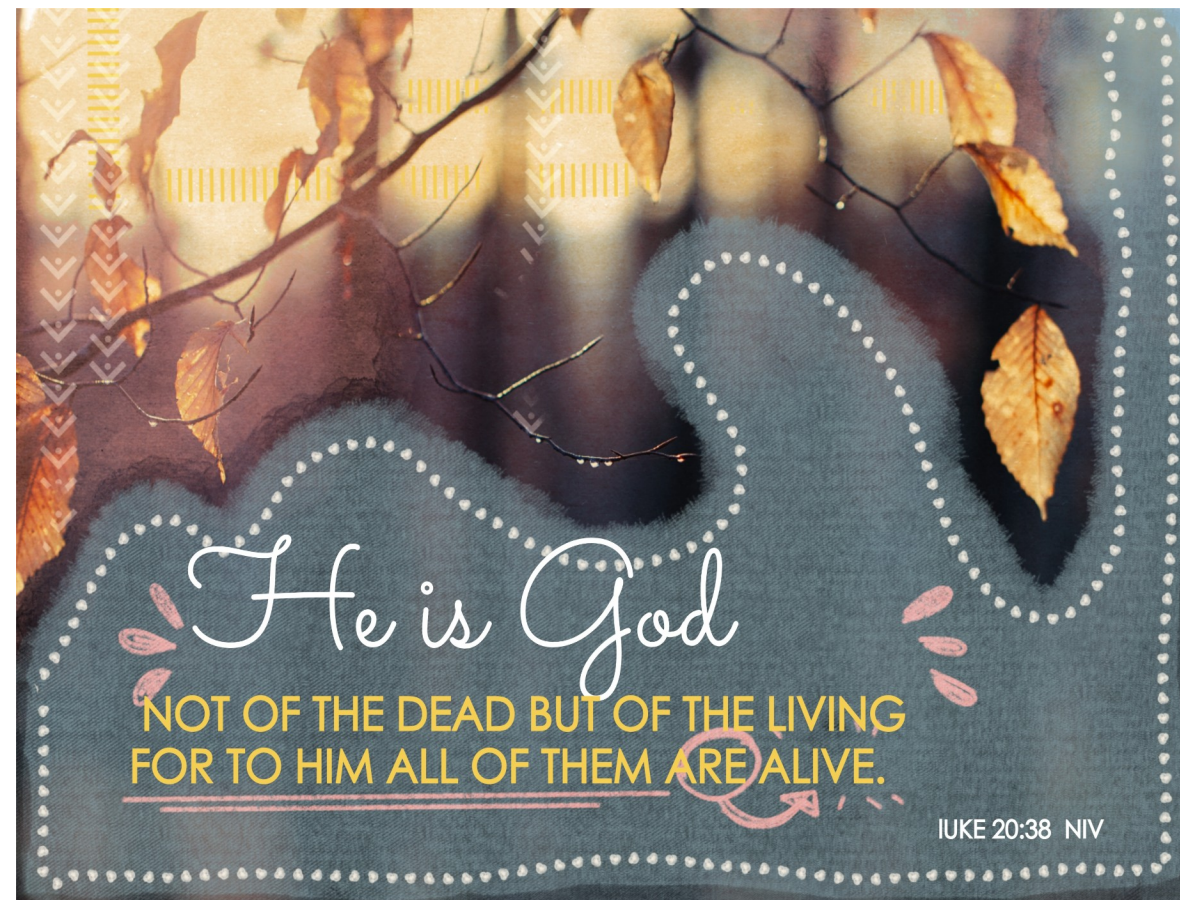

Christ Church Grocery Cart: Many thanks for your continued support of Christ Church's food collection mission to supply food (unexpired), as well as paper and hygiene products, to the local food pantries. Amid the ongoing government shutdown, there are plans to suspend SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits and possibly not restore them. This will impact roughly 42 million Americans for whom food insecurity is already an issue. If and when SNAP benefits are reinstated, new restrictions are planned. Among the proposed changes are lowering the age of dependent children to 14 and raising the work requirement to 64, ending exemptions for veterans, homeless people, and young adults aging out of foster care. As winter and the holidays are approaching your assistance is greatly needed and appreciated. Thank you for supporting our ongoing mission.

Consecration Sunday: Please join us to celebrate God's wondrous generosity and our faithful response as an act of worship on Sunday, November 16.
